



Dizzy Heights® and Pocketshots™ FAQ's

Will the video lesson play on my PC or Apple Mac?

Yes - the file format is MPEG4 which is a modern and common method of compressing and formatting video files. Your PC may require certain software such as a new version of Windows Media Player version 9 or above, or QuickTime Version 7.1. Your Apple Mac may need QuickTime installed to play the file.

You can use Windows Media Player - we have V11.0. To do this you need to click <File> <Open> then select <*. *> for all files in the directory you've saved the files. You should then find the MP4 files (we do not understand why Microsoft has not made this automatic), when you open one you should get a message asking you if you want the player to always associate these files - click this and hopefully it will not argue next time you try and play one.

Or, better still, you can use Apple QuickTime for PC or Mac, we are using Version 7.1.1. You can download a free copy of the basic version: www.apple.com/quicktime/win.html.

This should play the files quite happily at their proper resolution (i.e. sized for a mobile phone/iPod) and you can even make the window bigger although picture quality may degrade slightly. We tend to use QuickTime for viewing these files as it is more user friendly.

Downloading and Using Your Pocketshots Video™ lesson

You will receive an email with a link and password to download the videos. These files are quite large and it is best done overnight. The files are zipped using WinZip Version 11.0, so you may need to download a free evaluation copy of WinZip from www.winzip.com.

Once the Pocketshots Video™ lesson is on your PC or Mac you can simply connect your mobile phone, iPod or media player to your PC or Mac with the cable normally supplied with your phone and copy the file across to your mobile device.

Will the video lesson play on my mobile phone or media player or iPod® Video?

Yes - the file format is MPEG4 which is a modern and common method of compressing and formatting video files so it should work on most modern devices. However, it will not work on older mobile devices that cannot play video files. The first thing to do is try it! Then if it's not working check the manual for your device. Or look in the media folders on your device and see if there is already a video pre-installed by the manufacturer. If there is, this is usually a good sign, and you should be able to press 'options' to find details of the format of the file.

Do remember you need to check the disk size of your mobile (these can be very cheaply upgraded to upto 2GB these days which is why we have kept the file quality high).

We are also currently preparing these files as slightly lower resolution .3GP files, this works on a wider range of older phones, but the quality is unfortunately reduced. Please contact us if you would like them in this format (feedback@dizzyheights.com).

How do I copy files across from my PC to my mobile phone, media player, iPod?

Once it's on your PC you can simply connect your mobile phone, iPod® or media player to your PC with the cable normally supplied with your phone and copy the file across to your mobile device using any file management software or iTunes for your iPod®. If in doubt, have a look at the instructions that came with your phone or look at the support section of your mobile phone manufacturer's website. Here are a few useful links:
